Emily Dawson, Department of Science & Technology Studies at University College London, UK

Emily Dawson is associate professor at Univeristy College London (UCL). Her research explores how people learn about and engage with science, with an emphasis on inclusion and social justice. Her current project is called Youth Equity and STEM, which is developing evidence-based approaches to building informal science learning practices that support minoritised youth to enjoy, engage with and learn about science.



Melissa Glackin, Education, Communication and Society, King's College London, UK

Melissa Glackin is lecturer of science education at King's College London. Her research focuses on teaching science outside the classroom and the place of environmental education in schools. Melissa is currently working on a national review of environmental education in Japanese high schools.



Patricia Patrick, Counseling, Foundations and Leadership, Columbus State University, USA



Patricia Patrick is assistant professor at Columbus State University. Her work focuses on the importance of social interactions and the importance of those interactions within families. Her current project is applying actor network theory to understand family interactions at the Museum fur Naturkunde (Berlin), Tennessee Aquarium (USA), and Oxbow Environmental Learning Center.



Workshop abstract

Fondazione Golinelli, which opened 1988, is a unique living experiment that aims to 'provide the younger generations with new tools to understand the future that awaits them so that they can become tomorrow's actively responsible protagonists'. As well as understanding how Fondazione Golinelli has become established, we will examine how the 'open ecosystem' enables activities including education, training, research, technology transfer, incubation, acceleration, venture capital, dissemination and the promotion of the sciences and arts. Following a guided tour and insights into this model, we will explore how out-of-classroom settings, such as Golinelli, as well as present exciting opportunities for research also throw up ethical dilemmas, many of which have no easy solutions. We invite ESERA members to share the ethical challenges they have faced when researching out-of-classroom education – and possibly leaving with a solution to a tricky current ethical research conundrum.
